If fgdc-root.xml, it has the control to display the buttons or not. The control is the parameter "enableFGDCediting". However, this param was not be set in Metacat. In MetacatHandler class, we add code to set parameter "enableFGDCediting", then it works.

I have a question about the "Set Access" button. Currently, if a doc is NOT public readable, the "public read" check box for the button will be unchecked; if a doc is public readable, the "public read" check box for the button will be checked. I think we should do the opposite way. What do you think?

I think the checkbox should reflect the current state of the document. If it is unchecked, that indicates that it is not publicly readable. If I check it and update the document, then it should stay checked to indicate that my change was successful. If I wish to revoke public read access, I should be able to uncheck the box and update the document at which point it will remain unchecked to indicate that the document is not publicly readable.
